Scripture Reflection

"When God loves me, God desires nothing else than to be loved by me. God loves me in order that I may love God because God knows well that all who love God, find in this very love their Joy and happiness." — Bernard of Clairvaux

Jesus said, "The first commandment is this: Hear, O Israel: The Lord your God is the only Lord. Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength. The second is this: Love your neighbor as yourself. There is no commandment greater than these." *Mark* 12:29-31

God loves us that we may love God and know the fulness of joy from living in love with God and one another.

The Psalm extolls the mercy, faithfulness and righteousness of God and tells of God's marvelous works and salvific acts. What's not to love about that?

The story from Acts tells of Gentiles who were moved in the Spirit and "extolling God." These new converts were moved in the power of the Spirit and God's love to exhibiting their love of God with their lips and in their lives.

The epistle from 1 John is a reminder that if we believe that "God so loved the world that he gave his only-begotten Son, then our faith in that love will empower us to love God and one another. As we gain in the knowledge of God's way of love in Christ and grow in living out that way of love, we become more and more in tune with the Spirit of truth and experience victory.

"The steady discipline of intimate friendship with Jesus results in persons becoming like him." -- Harry Emerson Fosdick

In the gospel lesson from John, Jesus teaches and shows how much he is loved by God by living out that love for God and all that God has made. He reminds his disciples to abide in his love, the same love that God has for him and each and every one of us. If we abide in the love of God in Christ Jesus, we experience complete joy.

"In the evening of life, we shall be judged on love, and not one of us is going to come off very well, and were it not for my absolute faith in the loving forgiveness of my Lord I could not call on him to come." -- Madeleine L'Engle

We know that we struggle to love God as Jesus commands and perhaps even more to love one another, but we can strive to keep and grow our faith in God's love for us. We are reminded by God's word and Our Lord Jesus Christ to start with loving God, that the peace of God, which passes all understanding, will indeed keep our hearts in the knowledge and love of God and of God's Son. If indeed God so loved the world, what's not to love?
